

FEMA Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) Program (FY24–25) Overview

Purpose

- Federal funding for hazard mitigation infrastructure projects
- Goal: Reduce disaster risk and future disaster costs for all hazards
- Focus on high-impact, shovel-ready infrastructure resilience projects

Funding Overview

- \$1B total funding - \$757M for national competition, \$2M for every state, \$50M for building codes
- 75% federal / 25% non-federal match
 - Maximum per project is \$20M for national competition
- Typical grant timeline: ~36 months

Opportunity Listing - Fiscal Year 2024 & 2025 Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)

Eligible Project Types

1. Infrastructure Projects (Primary Focus)
 - Roads, bridges, utilities, buildings, natural systems
 - Must show clear risk reduction + cost-effectiveness (BCA required)
 - Must have $\geq 30\%$ conceptual design
2. Capability & Capacity Building (Limited)
 - Only if tied to infrastructure (e.g., design and permitting for infrastructure project)
 - HMP updates NOT eligible
3. Management Costs
 - Admin support (up to 10% for States, 5% for municipalities)

Eligible Applicants

- Applicants: States, tribes, territories
- Sub-applicants: Local governments, communities, planning districts, counties
 - Must have FEMA-approved Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP)
